## Mission Statement

A non-profit organization, organized under the laws of the State of Arkansas, founded by Arkansas Deer Hunters for Arkansas Deer Hunters:

to provide a unified voice and to serve the interests of its voting membership;

to promote and protect both public and private hunting opportunities in Arkansas;

to promote encouragement and hunting opportunities for the youth, handicapped and underprivileged citizens of Arkansas;

to promote and protect hunting rights and opportunities for its members on an equal basis without prejudice toward race, sex, handicap, religion, or place of origin;

to conserve and improve Arkansas' resources to ensure a reasonable balance between maximum enjoyment and responsible conservation;

to promote hunter education, hunter safety and ethical hunter sportsmanship in Arkansas;

to promote and protect all legal, ethical and fair chase methods of deer hunting in Arkansas;

to foster a working relationship as a pro-active partner with the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission, other governmental agencies, lawmakers, private land owners and the general public, in efforts to achieve the goals and objectives of the organization;

to promote and protect hunting season start dates, durations and bag limits while maintaining a good balance with a healthy and sustainable deer herd;

to improve habitat, the environment and the management of Arkansas' deer herd;

to promote education to our membership concerning health and biological issues that affect hunters and wildlife (e.g., Chronic Wasting Disease, Rocky Mountain Spotted Tick Fever and West Nile Virus);

to encourage its membership to support other legitimate non-profit hunting related organizations such as BeneficialKids, Hunters Helping Hunters and Hunt of a Lifetime;

to promote a positive image of deer hunters and deer hunting in Arkansas, and to perpetuate hunting traditions and opportunities for future generations to enjoy.

ADHA is an organization that assures its membership that any income will be utilized specifically for the operation and promotion of the organization and its officially sanctioned events; and in the event any income is spent otherwise, it shall be done so only when approved by the officers of the organization; and full disclosure of all income and expenditures shall be made on an annual basis to its membership;

ADHA shall not distribute any of its income outside the state of Arkansas, unless to make a purchase or contribution that cannot reasonably be made within Arkansas.

The Arkansas Deer Hunter's Alliance (ADHA) was founded in June, 2004. Our membership currently consists of over 350 persons, with members throughout the state. ADHA is incorporated as a non-profit - tax exempt organization. Our Mission Statement outlines our general goals and objectives and defines what our organization is about. In the short time since its inception, ADHA has already made a positive impact on many deer hunting issues. During 2005, ADHA lobbied the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission (AG&FC) to reinstate the last two weeks of archery season and baiting. We also lobbied the AG&FC to reinstate the two buck limit in the Ozark Mountain region. We conducted Family Deer Day at the Forest L. Wood - Crowley's Ridge Nature Center in Jonesboro.

In 2006, ADHA successfully lobbied to reinstate archery season, baiting and the two buck limit in the Ozark Mountain region. We were also instrumental in helping influence the AG&FC to enact regulations allowing the use of straight cased pistols in Zone 4, and forbidding the chase of game with motorized vehicles. ADHA members also developed a new Food Plot at Harold E. Alexander WMA and Wattensaw WMA.

Our annual meetings involve opportunities to meet fellow hunters and attend highly informative discussions and seminars. We're planning additional food plots, seminars and other deer related functions. Our members often meet for suppers, cookouts, and hunting and fishing outings. They stay informed through our quarterly newsletter and our discussion board.
